confronting child abuse in New Zealand

There are currently 6,590 children and young people in foster care.

On average one child dies every five weeks as a result of violence in New Zealand, children under 12 months old making up the majority.

More than two thirds of the victims were aged 2 or under.

Every 8th homicide victim in New Zealand from 2004 to 2019 was a child.

Of the cases where the killer's relationship to the victim was known, 27% were mothers, 24% were fathers, and 17% were de facto partners.

There are 14,000 substantiated findings of child abuse every year in New Zealand.

"Children have a right to be loved, nurtured and supported. Unfortunately, family violence can have devastating and life-long physical, emotional and psychological impacts and we continue to be worried about the lack of specialist family violence and child centred responses to help children recover from their trauma".

At Homes of Hope we provide Child Centred Play Therapy (CCPT) to children within our homes and also to children within our community who are recommended to us by schools and specialists.

child abuse in New Zealand continued

New Zealand has the 7th highest rate of child homicide in the OECD (out of 37 countries).

New Zealand Police respond to a domestic violence call-out every seven minutes.

Every year there are more than 150,000 Reports of Concern relating to children in this country.

The cost of child abuse in New Zealand is estimated to be around 3 percent of GDP approximately \$6 billion a year.
