RATA HOME RECOGNISED AS A KAUPAPA MAORI HOME

it is important for tamariki to know who they are

We are grateful that our service is now recognised as working from a Kaupapa Maori Framework. We have our own Kaitakawaenga (cultural guide), Nick Connal, to assist and further inform our practice. So what does it look like? Firstly in the little things, for example, meeting as a whanau morning and evening for chats and prayers. Saying prayers before kai time, like this one we say each evening. Learning waiata (songs) and whakatauki (proverbs) and tamariki learning their pepeha, connecting to their whanau, hapu, iwi and whenua.

LITTLE-BITS ABOUT HOMES OF HOPE.....

interesting tit bits

- Over the past 5 years more than 33500 bed nights have had little dreamers occupy them.
- 90% of our young tamariki are boys
- 250+ children have made their homes with us over 17 years!
- Our therapeutic wrap-around care, means that the children are able to remain in one placement with is for as long as is needed to ensure they have the the opportunity to work through the trauma they have experienced. It is with this internal work and growth, with our support, that sets the tamariki on a pathway for future success. Research indicates that 12-18 months produces better, more consistent outcomes for them.
- Less than 50% of required funds come from Oranga Tamariki. We are constantly looking for new ways to raise funds.
